GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Only online application and online payments are allowed.
- 2. Filling in of online application form for admission will start from 21 May 2019 at 12 noon. Online filling in of application form for admission will close on 16 June 2019 at 12 midnight.
- 3. For filling in of online form, please visit the college website: www.vidyamandira.ac.in
- 4. Cost of Application form including Test and/or Viva voce: Rs. 350.00 (for SC, ST, PH and G-BPL category); Rs. 400.00 (for OBCA & OBCB); Rs 450.00 (for all other General categories)
- **5.** One may fill out any number of application forms following the eligibility criteria mentioned in the admission norms.
- **6.** Please read the instructions carefully before filling out the forms.
- 7. Students must bring their admit card and the copy of online payment receipt (proof of the submission of fees) on the dates of the Admission Test, Viva Voce (if selected after Written Test), date of Admission (if selected after Viva Voce) and on the day of admission to the hostel. If any student fails to show the two documents mentioned above, his candidature is liable to be rejected.
- **8.** Previous years' questions may be downloaded from the college website www.vidyamandira.ac.in
- 9. Only regular candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination in 2019 or 2018 will be eligible to apply.
- 10. Please note that if any candidate fails to fulfill the eligibility criteria as mentioned in our admission notice, his candidature will automatically stand cancelled at any point of the admission process. The college authority will not be responsible for any such cancellation.
- 11. Students selected in the written test, must produce all relevant documents in the original during the interview/viva voce failing which their candidature will be cancelled.
- 12. Candidates must pay the admission charges (college and hostel) through cash/cheque/draft/online mode on the date of the Counselling for hostel suitability and admission suitability as mentioned in the notification. Fees and charges are printed in the prospectus which is available on the college website. Waitlisted candidates may bring the

- admission charges on the date they are asked to meet the Principal to know the possibility of their admission. However, this does not guarantee the admission in anyway.
- 13. If any student fails to appear in the process of the Counselling for hostel suitability and admission, his candidature will be cancelled. Waitlisted candidates too may note that if they fail to come on the specific date and time mentioned for them to meet the Principal for Counselling-cum-admission in the vacant seats, their candidature will be cancelled.

IMPORTANT POINTS TO NOTE

- 3. Results of the entrance test and/or viva voce will be published on the website and on the college notice board.

- 5. The college authority will not be able to change the date and time of any entrance test or viva voce, if it coincides with the date and time of the entrance test/s of other institutions. Candidates and their guardians are earnestly requested not to make any such appeal.
- 6. The candidates must see the date and time of their entrance tests, viva voce (if selected) and Counselling for hostel suitability, final admission (if selected) and be present accordingly. The college authority will not be responsible for any mistake.
- 7. The college authority, under unavoidable circumstances, may change the date and time of any part of the schedule mentioned in this notification. However, such change will be notified on the college website before 6 pm on the immediately preceding day. Therefore, all candidates are requested to check the website after this hour to be sure of the date and time.

- Aggregate marks will be calculated as follows:
 - a. West Bengal Higher Secondary candidates (2019/2018): Bengali + English + top 3 subjects other than Bengali and English and excluding Environmental Studies.
 - b. Other Boards (2019 or 2018): Top Four subjects excluding the compulsory Environmental Studies/ Education.
- Total marks (theoretical + practical) for lab-based subjects would be taken into account for the subject marks.

• SPECIAL NORMS FOR CERTAIN CATEGORIES:

- (i) The required qualifying marks for reserved categories are as per the Government norms.

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*N.B.: The cut-off marks for the Mathematics Hons for candidates qualifying the Regional Mathematical Olympiad (RMO) will be 45% (aggregate and/or Mathematics). However, he is required to produce such certificate during Viva Voce (if selected in the written Test). If such candidates become unable to fill up forms online, they may come to the college office and meet the Principal with all necessary documents.

Important Notes on Revised CBCS Pattern to be introduced from 2019-2020 session:

- 1. Under this CBCS system a student of any Undergraduate 3 year / 6 Semesters Honours Programme is required to take
 - a) Core Courses (CC): 84 Credits
 - 14 Core Courses (CC) in 6 Semesters as 14 Honours Papers
 - b) Discipline Specific Elective Courses: 24 Credits
 - 4 Discipline Specific Electives (DSE) courses in last 2 Semesters (2 DSEs in 5th and 2 DSEs in 6th semesters) offered as 4 papers included in his Honours subject.
 - Among these 4 DSEs 1 or 2 may be Project work. This will be determined by the Honours Department.
 - c) Generic Elective Courses (GE): 24 Credits (list of Generic Elective Subjects are given below)
 - Within first four Semesters (i.e. within 1st, 2nd 3rd and 4th semester), a student has to opt for 2 Generic Elective (GE) Subjects each of which will have 2 Courses / 2 papers.
 - Thus, in each semester a student will have to take one Course / Paper of one Generic Elective Subject only.
 - A student will be allowed to select his General Elective Subject 1 in Semester 1 and he will have to continue with the same Generic Elective Subject in Semester 2. It means that he will not be able to opt for a new Generic Elective Subject / Course in Semester 2. However, in Semester 3, he will again be allowed to opt for another Generic Elective Subject / Course and this new one will continue in the Semester 4. This means that a student will have to study:
 - Course 1 / Paper 1 of Generic Elective Subject 1 in Semester 1,
 - Course 2 / Paper 2 of Generic Elective Subject 1 in Semester 2,
 - Course 1 / Paper 1 of Generic Elective Subject 2 in Semester 3,
 - Course 2 / Paper 2 of Generic Elective Subject 2 in Semester 4.
 - However, students should take note of the following conditions before opting for any Generic Elective Subject / Course.
 - A student can take any one of the Generic Elective Subject offered by the college as mentioned below except one which he has taken as his Honours subject / course. It means that if a student of Physics Honours Programme intends to opt for Generic Elective Subject / Course in English or Bengali or Philosophy etc., he is

- allowed to do so, but he will not be allowed to take any Generic Elective Subject / Course from Physics.
- A student must have the prerequisite qualifications as mentioned in the following table to opt for those Generic Elective Subjects where such prerequisite qualifications are mandatory. If no such prerequisite qualifications are mentioned against any Generic Elective Subject / Course, then it means that any student can opt for that subject.
- A student must consult his mentor-teachers of the Honours Department before opting for any Generic Elective Subject / Course.

d) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): 8 Credits

- English Language and Bengali Language / Alternative English :
 - 4 Courses means 4 papers
 - One English Language Course / Paper and One Bengali Language
 Course / Paper in Semester 1
 - One English Language Course / Paper and One Bengali Language
 Course / Paper in Semester 2
- Environmental Studies :
 - One Environmental Studies Course / Paper in Semester 3
 - One Environmental Studies Course / Paper in Semester 4

e) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): 8 Credits

- Value-Oriented Course
- In all 6 Semesters all students have to study these courses.
- In each Semester one Paper is allotted for this course.

III. DETAILS OF ADMISSION TEST:

1. ENGLISH HONOURS

Selection Procedure:

- > Selection will be done purely on the basis of marks obtained in the admission test.
- The admission test will have two parts: Written Examination (30 marks) and Viva Voce (20 marks).
- The written examination will be of <u>90 minutes</u> duration.
- > It will have two parts:
 - o Part 1: Grammar
 - 10 objective type questions of 1 mark each = 10 marks
 - There will be no negative marking in the objective type questions.
 - Part 2: **Composition** (10+20=30 marks).
 - In Sub-Part A of this Part 2 (10 marks) candidates will have to write an appreciation of a given literary piece within 200 words.
 - In Sub-Part B of this Part 2 (20 marks) candidates will be required to express their views on a given topic within 400 words.
- ➤ In Part 2, i.e. Composition, the answer scripts of only those candidates will be evaluated who secure the requisite cut-off marks in Part 1. The cut-off marks will be determined by the Department after evaluation of Part 1. This cut-off marks will be mentioned in the result of the written test which will be published on the website on the date mentioned in this notification.
- Marks obtained in Part 2 ONLY will be considered while short-listing candidates for viva voce. The marks obtained in Part 1 will NOT be considered for shortlisting candidates for the viva-voce.
- The final merit list for admission will be prepared out of the candidates short-listed for viva voce. This merit list will be prepared combining marks obtained in Part 2 of the written test, i.e., Composition (10+20=30 marks) and marks obtained in Viva Voce (20 marks), i.e. total 50 marks.
- \triangleright Total seats in the subject = 10 (approximately)

2. BENGALI HONOURS

- > Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- ➤ Candidates will be tested in simple Bengali composition essay writing, amplification and substance writing.
- There will be an interview of the candidates selected *only* on the basis of the written test.
- Final selection will be done on the basis of marks obtained in the Written Test (50) + Viva Voce (10) = 60 marks.
- ➤ Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

3. SANSKRIT HONOURS

- Full marks for the written test: 30 (1 hour)
- ➤ Candidates will be tested in simple translation from Bengali/English to Sanskrit; basic Sanskrit grammar, Sanskrit writing skill and common questions on Sanskrit literature.
- There will be a viva voce of the candidates selected *only* on the basis of the written test.
- Final selection will be done on the basis of marks obtained in the Written Test (30) + Viva Voce (20) = 50 marks.
- \triangleright Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

4. HISTORY HONOURS

- > Full marks for the written test: 20 (40 mts)
- Written Examination: Essay (400 words) [in English or Bengali]: Marks 20
- There will be a viva voce of the candidates selected *only* on the basis of the written test (marks 20).
- ➤ Final selection will be done on the basis of marks obtained in the Written Test (20) + Viva Voce (10) = 30 marks.
- \triangleright Total seats in the subject = 10 (approximately)

5. POLITICAL SCIENCE HONOURS

- > Full marks for the written test: 20 (40 mts)
- ➤ Question Pattern: 2 questions of 10 marks each (write each within 100 words). It can be written in English / Bengali.
- There will be a viva voce of the candidates selected *only* on the basis of the written test (marks 20).
- Final selection will be done on the basis of marks obtained in the Written Test (20) + Viva Voce (10) = 30 marks.
- \triangleright Total seats in the subject = 10 (approximately)

6. PHILOSOPHY HONOURS

- > Full marks for the test: 20 (40 mts)
- Essay: 20 marks. It can be written in English / Bengali (maximum word limit 400 words).
- There will be a viva voce of the candidates selected *only* on the basis of the written test (marks 20).
- Final selection will be done on the basis of marks obtained in the Written Test (20) + Viva Voce (10) = 30 marks.
- \triangleright Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

7. PHYSICS HONS:

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- b) There shall be 25 questions of 2 marks each covering the whole of H.S [XI & XII] Course and majority of these will be problem-oriented. Appreciable number of questions will be set from class XI syllabus also.
- c) A merit list will be prepared on the basis of the marks secured by the student in the **written test**. Students included in this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected. Students may use calculators.
- d) Final selection will be done on the basis of marks obtained in the Written Test (50) + Viva Voce (10) = 60 marks.
- e) Total seats in the subject = 16 (approximately)

8. CHEMISTRY HONS:

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- b) There shall be 25 MCQ type questions of 2 marks each covering the syllabus taught both in class XI and XII standards. There will be no negative marking.
- c) Candidates have to select the correct choice.
- d) A merit list will be prepared on this basis: 50 (admission test) + 25 (from aggregate) + 25 (from H.S. Chemistry marks) = 100. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce as mentioned below. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
- e) *The final selection* will be done after adding the viva voce marks (10) to the marks secured as per the details mentioned above.
- f) Total seats in the subject = 18 (approximately)

9. MATHEMATICS HONS:

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- b) There shall be 25 MCQ type questions covering the syllabus taught both in class XI and XII standards, each carrying 2 marks. For each wrong answer, -1 will be awarded.
- c) Candidates have to select the correct choice. Calculator is not allowed.
- d) A merit list will be prepared on the basis of:
 50 (admission test) + 20 (reduced from H.S. Mathematics) = 70. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce as mentioned below. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
- e) *The final selection* will be done after adding the viva voce marks (30) to the marks secured as per the details mentioned above.
- f) Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

10. MICROBIOLOGY HONS:

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
 - b) Syllabus: Entire 10+2 Biology (Class XI and XII)
 - c) Number of Questions: 25
 - d) Types of Questions:
 - i) MCQ Type: 20 questions each carrying 2 marks
 - ii) Assertion and reasoning Type: 5 questions each carrying 2 marks
 - e) Deduction of Marks: 0.5 marks will be deducted for one wrong answer.
 - f) Medium of question: Both English and Bengali
 - g) Answer sheet: Put correct option in the respective box
 - e) The Candidate may carry his own calculator in the examination hall.
 - f) A preliminary merit list will be prepared on this basis: 50 (admission test) + 20 (reduced from H.S. Chemistry marks) + 20 (reduced from H.S. Biology) = 90. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
 - g) The final selection will be done after adding the viva voce marks (10) to the marks secured as per the details mentioned above.
 - h) Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

11. ZOOLOGY HONS:

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- b) There shall be 25 MCQ each of 2 marks. These questions will cover the entire syllabus taught in both class XI and XII
- c) Negative Marking- at the rate of 0.5 for each wrong answer.
- d) The Candidate may carry own calculator in the examination hall.
- e) A preliminary merit list will be prepared on this basis: 50 (admission test) + 15 (reduced from H.S. Chemistry marks) + 25 (reduced from H.S. Biology) = 90. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
- f) *The final selection* will be done after adding the viva voce marks (10) to the marks secured as per the details mentioned above.
- g) Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

12. COMPUTER SCIENCE HONS:

- a) Full marks of the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- b) There shall be 25 MCQ questions of 2 marks each, covering Mathematics syllabus taught both in XI and XII standard. Each wrong answer will result in (-1). Rough work should be done in the limited space provided.
- c) Candidates have to select the correct choice.
- d) Calculator is not allowed.
- e) There will be an interview of the candidates <u>preliminarily</u> selected *only* on the basis of the written test. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce as mentioned below. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
- f) The final selection will be done on the basis of the marks secured in the written test (50) + viva voce (10)=60.
- g) Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

13. INDUSTRIAL CHEMISTRY HONS:

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour)
- b) There shall be 25 MCQ type questions each carrying 2 marks covering Chemistry syllabus taught both in class XI and XII standards. Each wrong answer will result in (-1). Rough work should be done in the limited space provided.
- c) Calculator is not allowed.
- d) Candidates have to select the correct choice.
- e) A merit list will be prepared on this basis: 50 (admission test) + 25 (from aggregate) + 25 (from H.S. Chemistry marks) = 100. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce as mentioned below. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
- f) *The final selection* will be done after adding the viva voce marks (10) to the marks secured as per the details mentioned above.
- g) Total seats in the subject = 11 (approximately)

14. **ECONOMICS HONS:**

- a) Full marks for the written test: 50 (1 hour 30 mts)
- b) Candidates will be tested in [Higher Secondary] Mathematics (30) and English (essay writing) (20) = 50 marks.
- c) Calculator is not allowed.
- d) A preliminary merit list will be prepared on this basis: 50 (admission test) + 50 (reduced from H.S. aggregate) = 100. The students of this merit list will have to appear in a viva voce as mentioned below. The students who will remain absent in the viva will be summarily rejected.
- e) *The final selection* will be done on the following basis: 50 (admission test) + 50 (reduced from H.S. aggregate)+ Viva voce (25) = 125
- f) Total seats in the subject = 10 (approximately)
